COUNSELLING AND SUPPORT GROUPS

Dealing with the trauma and grief, then integrating this tragic event into daily living requires courage and support. This support may come from partners, family, friends and counsellors.

We have qualified, experienced Counsellors who can work with you. All counselling is confidential.

Our counselling service is about empowerment through support and understanding.

We conduct group or individual, face to face and/or telephone counselling.

An interpreter can be arranged if necessary.

SUPPORT GROUPS

The Road Trauma Support Network recognises that those who share a common experience can best understand and support others in their grief and pain. For this reason the Support Group aims to bring people together in a caring and safe environment to give and receive mutual support. Each Support Group meeting is facilitated by a professional Counsellor.

ADVOCACY & COURT SUPPORT

Clients undergoing counselling often have current cases in the legal system and require additional support while they attend court. We may be able to organise professional support during this process, using our own staff or by referral to another court support provider.

Understanding and warmth from those who care about you in time of trauma and pain..



CONFERENCING

We support the Conferencing process, where, in a structured, assisted format, victims are able to confront those who have caused them harm. A trained Conference Facilitator provides a safe environment and our Counsellors help you with adequate preparation and support you throughout the process.

Conferencing is a powerful tool for emotional healing and acceptance.

EDUCATION

Personal experience helps people to see issues in a very different light. Often those insights are valuable in bringing about change.

Change is very personal and may come in many ways. As we grow through our experience we can assist others.

Lobbying government in an appropriate manner may lead to legislative change. Part of our agenda is to raise awareness of the consequences of irresponsible road use. To that end we run programs in schools, with community groups and court directed programs. We work with councils on road safety issues.

The successful traffic offenders program has come about as a result of a group of dedicated volunteers who turned their own personal tragedy into a commitment to make a positive difference.

Reason for the Service

Each year a great number of people lose their lives or are badly injured in crashes or road rage incidents. These tragedies cause immense emotional and physical pain for the survivors and the families of those killed or injured.

The sudden and tragic death of a family member or friend is traumatic and the grief of loss is intense. The lives of those left behind are changed forever.

We believe that our programs can minimise the future impact of road trauma and its long term effects on individuals and the broader community.

Aims of the Service

To assist people affected by any form of vehicle trauma by promoting the availability of support services through Enough is Enough and other appropriate organisations both government and non-government.

To provide education programs and initiatives which raise the awareness of responsible road use.

To advocate for legislative change focussed on lowering the incidence and impact of road trauma.
